# Fire warden training for construction sites

## Aim of the course

To provide those who are appointed as Fire Wardens on construction sites with an understanding of their role and responsibilities and some general Fire Safety knowledge.

## **Objectives**

During this session participants will:

- Outline the different ways a fire can develop
- Describe the fire wardens key role and responsibility on construction sites
- Discuss some key fire prevention measures on construction sites
- List some fire hazards and the Fire Wardens role in feeding into the risk assessment
- Discuss the importance of a an emergency plan, escape routes and signage
- Explain an evacuation procedure
- Name the different types of fire extinguisher and their use
- Familiarise themselves on how to use a fire extinguisher effectively
- Take part in a practical on site fire hazard identification exercise

#### Who is it for?

This workshop is aimed at site managers and site supervisors appointed as fire wardens on construction sites.

#### Duration

The workshop is broken into two parts which will take 3 - 4 hours in total depending on numbers attending.

The first part will involve some discussion, information giving and exercises (2 hours).

The second is for participants to conduct a hazard identification exercise on site followed by feedback on findings (1 hour).

## Style of delivery

Interactive and practical to meet a range of learning styles.

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#### Materials

A work book will be provided and the facilitator will share some key points and diagrams on PowerPoint slides.

There will also be some practical exercises.

Some hazard identification sheets will be provided with clip boards for participants to conduct the onsite exercise.

Certificates will be provided after the training which are valid for one year.
