



Understanding CDM regulations for managers

Overview

The Construction (Design and Management) Regulations 2015 made changes to the roles and responsibilities for health and safety at pre construction and construction stages of projects. The regulations introduced a new role of Principle Designer to lead at design and construction stages to ensure health and safety is embedded into the delivery of the project.

Regardless of your role in a project it is essential that you should understand your own responsibilities and be aware of the responsibilities of others.

Aim of this workshop:

Help managers of projects, site managers, supervisors and other members of construction teams to understand the implications of the CDM regulations for their roles.

Objectives

During this workshop participants will:

- Discuss the scope and nature of the duties attaching to each of the roles
- Focus on the new duties introduced in 2015 for health and safety for the role of the Principle Designer
- Explore the stages of a construction project and how the responsibilities for health and safety change during the life of a project
- Discuss the importance of proper planning and preparation of construction projects
- Look at an overview of pre construction information documents, construction phase plans and organisational and operational (health and safety) files
